NEVADA AIR NATIONAL GUARD ACTIVATED TO ASSIST WITH WILDFIRE EFFORTS

Reno, Nev.— The Department of Agriculture's Forest Service has mobilized six Department of Defense C-130 aircraft equipped with Modular Airborne Firefighting Systems (MAFFS) to combat a surge in wildfire activity across the Western United States. The aircraft, provided by the Air Force Reserve Command's 302nd Airlift Wing from Peterson Space Force Base, the California Air National Guard's 146th Airlift Wing, the Wyoming Air National Guard's 153rd Airlift Wing, and the local Nevada Air National Guard's 152nd Airlift Wing—the "High Rollers." All units are currently supporting ongoing firefighting efforts.

As of the date of this article, the High Rollers have twenty-three personnel activated along with two aircraft--MAFFS 8 and MAFFS 9. Between July 18 and July 28, MAFFS 8 has logged 44 drops, using 118,871 gallons or 1,066,272.9 pounds of retardant.

The C-130s, converted into airtankers with MAFFS, are capable of delivering up to 3,000 gallons of fire retardant in less than 10 seconds across a quarter-mile line. These aircraft are currently flying out of Channel Islands Air National Guard Station in Port Hueneme, California, and are augmenting current

firefighting resources.

Given the military's non-compete clause with private industry, contracted air tankers receive first request for largescale, wildland firefighting. Military units have provided a surge capacity with MAFFS since 1974 but are only activated after private contracted assets are exhausted and the Forest Service deems additional support is necessary.

The activation came as the National Wildfire Preparedness Level was elevated to 4 (PL 4) and then later escalated to 5 (PL 5), the highest level, due to significant wildfire activity and the high potential for new large fires. The national firefighting effort is now heavily committed, with coordination being managed by the National Interagency Coordination Center.

Fire managers from federal, state, tribal and local agencies continue to support wildland firefighting activity. As of August 2nd, 94 large active wildfires are being managed with full suppression strategies nationwide. Current fires have burned 2,101,281 acres nationwide. 29,278 wildland firefighters and support personnel are assigned to wildfires, including 27 complex and five Type 1 incident management teams, 650 crews, 1,834 engines, 172 helicopters, and six Modular Airborne Fire Fighting Systems, or MAFFS aircraft. Active to extreme fire behavior continues across multiple geographic areas, with evacuation orders in effect on 28 wildfires., according to NIFC.

"I am consistently awed and humbled by how our wing steps up day after day, year after year to meet so many requirements," said Col. Catherine Grush, 152nd Airlift Wing Commander, Nevada Air National Guard. "However, MAFFS is that one mission that we see such an impact across our communities. Knowing that we are saving lives, jobs and homes of our fellow citizens is a herculean task that our team delivers with utmost professionalism and passion. My thanks and appreciation for what everyone does to ensure we bring our best for an extremely dangerous mission will never be enough. Thank you and keep flying!"

The High Rollers have received an extension of the current activation. They're now extended into mid-September and a second aircraft from the 152nd Airlift Wing, MAFFS 9, is now also activated on August 2nd.

Tech. Sgt. Shelby DeSimone, Air Force "Core Values Model"

RENO, NV — Tech. Sgt. Shelby DeSimone, the Maintenance Training Manager with the 152nd Maintenance Squadron, has been recognized as the Wing Refueling Document Control Officer Second Quarter winner at the National Guard Bureau level. This accolade underscores her exceptional contributions to the Wing's operational efficiency and financial management.

Over the past quarter, DeSimone has made remarkable strides in addressing long-standing issues with fuel bill accounting. She effectively eradicated a ~5year backlog of overdue fuel bills and accounting discrepancies, bringing the Wing to a state of 100% compliance and financial accuracy.

Her dedication was particularly evident in her role as a Resource Advisor and Wing Refueling Document Control Officer, where she stepped in to fill a crucial gap in personnel. DeSimone's efforts led to a dramatic reduction in overdue KROPP bills, from 546 days overdue to zero, within just three months. She also revamped the Wing's management internal



control toolset checklist, closing out two significant overdue observations to ensure top-notch inspection readiness.

In addition to these accomplishments, DeSimone authored the first official 152nd Airlift Wing Instruction for the Wing Refueling Document Control Officer Program. This new guideline, created in accordance with AFI 11-253, standardizes expectations across the Wing, enhancing accountability and clarity.

DeSimone's commitment to excellence is further reflected in her proactive approach to learning and collaboration. She engaged with program experts and attended the National Guard Bureau's Wing Refueling Document Control Officer conference, expanding her knowledge and fostering valuable connections with other units.

Her contributions extended beyond the 152nd Airlift Wing. She played a key role in coordinating payments for \$43,000 worth of ground services with United States Air Forces in Europe missions, demonstrating her ability to manage significant financial responsibilities with precision.

In addition to her primary responsibilities, DeSimone processed and verified 161 "2096 forms" with a 98% accuracy rate, completed 78 Formal School Requests, and secured over 75 school dates. Her leadership and commitment to the Air Force's core values of "Integrity First" have earned her deep respect and appreciation from both her subordinates and superiors.

Tech. Sgt. Shelby DeSimone's achievements exemplify the High Roller mentality, and her contributions continue to set a high standard for operational excellence within the 152nd Airlift Wing.

FSS Fun Fact #2 -Annual Review of Personnel Records

High Rollers,

Did you know that each year on your birthday you will receive an email from myFSS containing a birthday message? This message has two purposes. One, it's to wish you a happy birthday and two, it's reminding you to review your personnel records. It is mandatory for you to update your records at least annually, when deploying, or when a life changing event occurs (e.g., marriage, divorce) so, please do not disregard those birthday messages. A few critical items requiring review:

Servicemembers' Group Life Insurance (SGLI): You can obtain more information about your Servicemembers' Group Life Insurance (SGLI) and Family Servicemembers' Group Life Insurance (FSGLI) via the SGLI Online Enrollment System (SOES). SOES can be accessed by logging into Milconnect and clicking the SOES link under the Benefits tab.

Record of Emergency Data (RED): This document contains emergency contact information should you become severely ill, injured, wounded, or deceased. It also allows you to designate the Person Authorized to Direct Disposition (PADD) of your remains, beneficiaries for Death Gratuity (DG) and Arrears of Pay (AOP). You can obtain more information about your RED on myFSS or update via AFPC Secure applications: https://w45.afpc.randolph.af.mil/AFPCSecureNet40/CheckPortal.aspx.

Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS): Contains information for each uniformed service member (active duty, retired, or a member of a Reserve Component), US-sponsored foreign military, Department of Defense (DoD) and uniformed services civilians, other personnel as directed by the DoD (including the patient population serviced through the Military Health Services System), and their eligible family members. DEERS registration is required for TRICARE eligibility and enrollment. Incorrect information in the DEERS database can cause problems with TRICARE claims as well as other health care benefits, so it is critical to maintain your DEERS information.

Air Force Personnel Accountability and Assessment System (AFPAAS): When emergencies or natural disasters occur, it is imperative to account for you and your family members. Please validate your information in the AFPAAS website. You can obtain more information about AFPAAS on myFSS or validate your AFPAAS via AFPAAS.

FSS has created how-to guides to assist you with updating your information in the various systems mentioned above. Should you have any questions, please call Customer Service at 788-4523.





ONLINE UNIFORMED SERVICES ID CARD (USID) RENEWAL

USID CARDS

- Issued to retired and reserve uniformed Service members, dependent family members, and other eligible individuals in accordance with DoD policy
- Used for access to benefits, privileges, and DoD facilities

CURRENT RENEWAL PROCESS

- S Must be done in person at a RAPIDS site
- Often requires an appointment scheduled in advance
- 🚫 No opportunity to renew online



WHAT'S CHANGING?

- Sponsors can request card renewals online, from anywhere
- Cards will be mailed to the cardholder via US mail
- No in-person requirement for most renewals

REQUIREMENTS

- Sponsor must be a CAC holder or have a DoD Self-Service Logon username/password
- · Must be requesting a renewal of an active USID card
- Sponsor and Cardholder must have email addresses listed in DEERS that they have authorized DoD to use for contacting them
- Sponsor's personnel status must extend at least 30 days into the future
- Cardholder has a photo saved in DEERS taken in the last 12 years
- Cardholder's mailing address is present in DEERS and is in United States
 - USID cards cannot be shipped to PO Boxes

The MHS GENESIS Patient Portal is a secure website for 24/7 access to yours or your dependents health information, exchange messages with your care team, and sending in outside records. The new patient portal is replacing the TRICARE Online Secure Patient Portal. You will be required to have a DS Logon or CAC.

To access the MHS GENESIS Patient Portal:

- Google "MHS GENESIS Patient Portal" or scan the QR Code below if you wish to access from your phone.
 - \circ $\;$ If accessing from your phone, you will need the Microsoft Authenticator app



- After scanning the QR Code, be sure to open it up in a browser so you can navigate to the Authenticator application.
- Log on with DS Logon or CAC.
 - If you do not have a DS Logon, click "Create New Account" and it will prompt you to create one.

Send a Message to the 152d Medical Group!

You can now send your outside health records via the Messaging function in MHS GENESIS!

- In your MHS GENESIS Patient portal, click "Messaging" at the top of the screen, then click "Send a message."
- Fill in the required fields. (In the "To" box, type in <u>152</u> and click "Air Natl Guard 152 MDG Readiness")
- Attach files you want to be input into your medical record.
- You may also use this function to request appointments.
