High Rollers deploy to assist with Hurricane Harvey recovery efforts

The Nevada Air National Guard mobilized a C-130 to help with the historic devastation caused by Hurricane Harvey. Upon notification, the crew of seven departed for Texas. After arriving, they were instantly tasked to fly into flood torn areas to help those in need. Over the past 7 days the C-130 crew flew 8 sorties for a total of 13.6 flight hours, air evacuated over a 137 passengers including 10 bound to wheelchairs, 4 dogs and 2 cats. The crew transported 9,000 pounds of cargo as well as moving 20 medical support personnel to support relief efforts.

The High Rollers assisting are: Capt. Reed Kobernik (aircraft commander), 1Lt Kevin Porter (co-pilot), Maj. Jeff Bellato (navigator), 2Lt Nicole McCray (navigator), Tech. Sgt. Ernie Spandau (loadmaster), Chief Master Sgt. Tom Glover, Tech. Sgt. Scott Bushey (loadmaster), and Tech. Sgt. Kevin Sidley (crew chief).

Currently more than 45,000 Guardsmen are engaged worldwide--including 1,200 fighting fires in Oregon, Montana and California; more than 19,000 of Texas National Guard and supporting states (including the High Rollers) responding to Hurricane Harvey and nearly 13,000 mobilized supporting the combatant commands overseas.

The National Guard stands ready to activate more guardsmen to support the Virgin Islands, Puerto Rico and Florida as Hurricane Irma targets them. There are 45,000 Guardsmen activated today, with the capacity (at 450,000 strong nationwide) to add thousands more should our governors or the president need it. This is exactly what makes the Guard vital to our nation!

Chief lauds Guard's operational capabilities at EANGUS conference

During his hour-long address, Gen. Joseph Lengyel, chief of the National Guard Bureau, encapsulated the theme of the 46th annual Enlisted Association of the National Guard of the United States conference in Reno this week with one statistic: 850,000.

That's the number of National Guard overseas deployments since 9/11, which nearly doubles all American wars combined going back to World War II.

That statistic highlights the National Guard's evolution from a strategic reserve to an operational force component, Lengyel said during his speech before about 800 soldiers, airmen, retirees, vendors and civilian who [CLICK FOR COMPLETE STORY](#)

Veterans Stand Down



Stand Down
In times of war, exhausted combat units requiring time to rest and recover were removed from the battlefields to a place of relative security and safety. At secure base camp areas, troops were able to take care of personal hygiene, get clean uniforms, enjoy warm meals, receive medical and dental care, mail and receive letters, and enjoy the camaraderie of friends in a safe environment.

Today, Stand Down refers to a grassroots, community-based intervention program designed to help the nation's estimated 107,000 homeless veterans on any given night "combat" life on the streets. Homeless veterans are brought together in a single location for one to three days and are provided access to the community resources needed to begin addressing their individual problems and rebuilding their lives. In the military, Stand Down afforded battle-weary soldiers the opportunity to renew their spirit, health and overall sense of well-being. Today's Stand Down affords the same opportunity to homeless veterans.

The 152nd Airlift Wing is providing travel sized toiletries for the Reno Stand Down 2017 event, being held Sept. 22nd. Shampoo, conditioner, soap, and lotion will be packaged and handed out. Any left overs will go to the Capitol Hill Veterans Outreach Center where they will be kept available.

Drop boxes are located in Bldgs: 56, 9, 500, 111, 600, 400, 88 and 10. If you can't find a drop box or have a large amount, you are welcome to drop them off at the Communications Flt/Security Forces Bldg. 500.

Members must sign-in with the hotel representatives to ensure they are accounted for in the rooms. Failure to sign-in or not showing up for a confirmed reservation will result in by-name notification to AW/CC. The cut-off day for reserving a room is COB three days prior to drill. The cut-off day to cancel reservations is COB two days prior to drill.

Members are authorized Friday night stays if they are outside the commuting distance. Please see the map on OneHome.

Members on any type of orders will make their own reservations and pay for it on their GTC. Services provides at least two base billeting list updates during the month to provide a list of members who are currently signed up for lodging.

All RUTA lodging requests must be submitted NLT 72 hours before needed and all RUTA lodging is provided at Stead. If member goes elsewhere or does not notify Services in advance, charges will not be reimbursed. If a member is on any type of orders, the member will make their own reservations and pay for it on their GTC. The member then will be reimbursed on their travel voucher with the receipt.
