

Members from the 152nd Civil Engineer Squadron, Fire Department participated in the Armed Forces Day celebrations in Hawthorne, Nev. on Saturday May 20th, 2017. The day began with a static display of military aircraft, civilian aircraft, and aircraft rescue fire fighting (ARFF) trucks at the Hawthorne airport in which members of the community were able to climb into the aircraft and the fire trucks. Fire protection specialists showed off the capabilities of the ARFF vehicles by allowing children take pictures holding a fire hose and looking at the jaws of life.

The day was highlighted by a parade in which over 60 floats and performers showed off their patriotic colors. This included Senior Master Sgt. Kevin Bandoni and Staff Sgt. Christopher Wagner who drove the 152nd Civil Engineer Squadron, Fire Department's Striker 1500 ARFF truck in the parade. "This is the biggest celebration that this town has all year. They put on a week-long celebration for Armed Forces Day. We are just glad to be a part of it" said Bandoni when asked about the events. The parade ended with members of the community

carrying a massive American Flag down the parade route to the flagpole that sits in the center of the town and was, of course, raised to the sound of the National Anthem. The day was then capped off with food from local vendors and events such as a mud crawl, karaoke, and a corn hole competition.

Hawthorne has a rich history of military pride and service. With the Hawthorne Army Depot covering 147,000 acres of the valley. The depot has been in Nevada since its establishment in 1930. It was originally called the Hawthorne Naval Ammunition Depot, but in 1977 command was transferred from the Navy to the Army and became the Hawthorne Army Ammunition Plant. In 1994 production of ammunition at the plant stopped and the name was changed to the Hawthorne Army Depot.

Even today in 2017 many of the residents work at the base in some capacity. However, the entire town is very patriotic and takes a lot of pride in its history and service to our nation. This was very present in the celebrations that were seen on Armed Forces Day.


